## A message from our FN George Ribellino

As we approach the end of the current fraternal year and approach the new fraternal year, I would love to thank you all for your continued support for Assembly 100 and the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree. I really appreciate your participation Assembly meetings, fundraiser, liturgical and patriotic events. Our Assembly is becoming a force to be reckoned with. We added 3 new Sir Knights and 4 transfers. I am excited about the energy that the new members will bring to this great group of Catholic Men making a difference.

At our June 5<sup>th</sup> meeting, Council 46 Home Association President and Assembly 100 member Kenny Prince spoke at our meeting about how Assembly 100 could help the Home Association with the rising expenses of running the Knights Hall. They put a proposal of \$1,000 per year until the current lease is up with the St .Ann Club in 3 years. This would be \$83 per month. SK Kenny and the board said we can use the hall for the Patriot Dinner and 2 more fundraiser dinners to assist the Assembly. SK Kenny will lead the kitchen staff to help us host the dinners with the only cost being the purchasing of the food. In addition, we can use the hall for additional officer meeting etc., as long as there is no scheduling conflict with Council 46. Essentially it would be a partnership and Brother Knights assisting each other. Financially we are in sound shape. With the dues going up to \$25 in 2020 based on a vote in 2017 and the 50/50 raffles at meetings, this is feasible. This decision is up to you; the members of Assembly 100. We voted to table a vote on the proposal for the September 4<sup>th</sup> Assembly meeting to give members as chance to ask questions and make an effort to attend. I will be including this blurb in emails and the Patriot Newsletter throughout the summer. Thanks to Worthy Faithful Comptroller Bud Boucher for coming up with the idea to do a 50/50 raffle at every meeting. It is a fun and easy way to raise some money for the Assembly and a chance for Sir Knight to win some money. So remember to bring some cash to the meetings. The tickets are 6 tickets for \$5 or \$1 for one ticket.

Another Fundraiser that Brother Bud Boucher is helping us with is Ambit Energy. This is a very simple program. The Assembly will receive between \$ 2.50 and \$9.00 per meter per month (based on each person's actual consumption) for anyone who signs up to use Ambit as their electricity provider under the Assembly 100 Affiliate Program. This is a program Ambit has created for non-profit organizations to generate funds for their charitable activities.
